The three priorities I've mentioned are dependent on state and federal government policies and measures. Local government is less equiped to achieve these ends.

The town has a poor planning record which has seen a sprawled development. Requirement for small house blocks in the main town - but probably too late.

The town is expanding. The local sub developments should have better pedestrian access with a safe place to walk/ride into town and back.

This needs to be an improved umbrella plan to cover all factors to bring about a more prosperous town. A plan that provides more incentives for both current residents to stay as their lives change and new residents to consider Bridgetown offers enough opportunities to make it worth their while settling here. The time for this is now while government is in economic recovery mode.

To be able to get approvals to your own property done at a reasonable time. As 3 months is way to long to wait for a shed to get approved. Not having to pay \$250 extra to get it approved in 2 weeks. All registered builders to be treated the same and not get continual knock backs because they aren't locals

To check bushland owned by the shire that is close to residential home for unsafe tree etc and either remove them or prune them.

Too much red tape.

Undeveloped areas to be used: Railway station and old BP station site.

Utilising all on offer by way of history and services to visitors and residents and future residents to create a growth demand while managing the process

Bridgetown is historically known as a difficult place to build due to Shire restrictions. What's the benefit of stifling development and enticing new people to the shire?

Build some rental housing for lower income earners.

Building permits are taking too long and to many requirements making it difficult for people to build

Consultation with the appropriate expert body's in all these areas.

Continue removing impediments to building and development - make this a place where builders want to build.

encourage bIN FILL development rathe rthan expand urbanisation

Encourage developer to build houses on small blocks for older/disabled people who can't manage a 1/4 acre garden but do not require entry to Geegeelups age home.

Enter into the public housing sector

Faster approvals

## **Building and maintaining local roads**

A lot of local streets are gravel and poorly maintained.

A lot of roads are in bad state of neglect . I've considered relocating due to the wear and tear it is having on my car it has never been repaired in my area in four years and my property sees all the storm water come flooding into my property the council never seem to be out doing much except repairing a pot hole to make it even worse to drive on ? Quality workers needed

A lot of the local roads need to be re-sealed. In some cases roads such as Peninsula Road need to be widened in the area from where the 70km sign commences (when travelling west) to the end of where there is housing. There are a lot of trucks travelling on this road due to development in Highlands Estate and if travelling east (towards town) there is no room to get off the road without potentially ending up in the gutter which is parts is quite steep

a programme to grade and maintain all gravel roads in the farming areas on a regular basis.

A roundabout at the top of Greys Hill would be an asset

After 6 years of living in the Shire I had hoped to see Elwins Road at least partially sealed.

Apply more grants.

Assess the many dirt roads in the town boundary with regard to safety, water run off, suitable drainage and maintenance.

Budget for sealing the worst cases

A more common sense approach from council on these matters

Basic maintenance of outer town gravel roads e.g Tweede Rd. Cleaning drains, top up gravel bitumen for Tweede; Possibility of a portion being done each year until it connects to Winnejup Rd.

better general maintenance and sealing gravel roads

Better maintain the roads outer rural areas, both gravel and bitumen. They are in a terrible condition compared to roads in the wheatbelt area. The road gutters and shoulders need to be graded much more regularly as well as the gravel roads.

better maintenance of unsealed roads and their "drainage" in the rural areas, including burning of "leaf litter" in the drains. HAMPTON STREET ISN'T THE ONLY STREET IN TOWN.



Better maintenance. I would like to see a crosswalk installed at the Shire office intersection. It is getting far too dangeous to cross the road.

Better marking of roads and giveway and stop signs - with increased population this is a priority.

Better road maintenance and increased scheduling of preventitive maintenance.

Better road surface Better signage

Both access roads to Highlands Estate are in a terrible condition. They need resurfacing and widening and better drainage to alleviate verges crumbling as they are doing now.

Bridgetown Town centre bypass. Sealing sections of high use gravel roads.

Carpark behind Civic Centre should have clear entry and exit. A number of gravel roads in the Shire that could benefit from either bitumenising or more regular grading. Some visible 'artowrks' that reduce visibility on some corners and potentially dangerous.

clean up the verges. grade the roads

Direct heavy traffic away from town centre.

Do something about the crossroads at Hampton and Steere st? Getting too dangerous there

Eastcott Ave and Cemetary Car Park need sealing. Cemetary Car Park in poor condition in wet weather and other unsealed roads near the township.

Employ more people, an area as large as BTGB needs a lot more people and equipment to maintain roads, verges, parks access. If they wish to be progressive and attract tourism and population growth then the best way is to be proactive and not reactive. The nations arteries are the roads and good roads will atract tourists, business and a willingness to travel and spend money and create employment. The formula is very simple and cost effective, fix the roads.

Fix and maintain them, clear fire hazards and fallen trees, not just the jarrah trees that have fallen.

Fix local roads asap continual program.

Fix the corrugations on the gravel roads, widen busy bitumen roads and improve the drop off on the side of the road (going past other vehicles and especially trucks is dangerous on many local roads).

For the islands in the middle of the road and some footpaths all round. Fix traffic islands (Jephson St).

Get all road sealed.

Grade roads and improve lighting - some roads are only 4x4 and intersections dangerously dark.

Grading of gravel roads more often.

Grading of gravel roads, widening of Mockerdillup Rd lots of tourists to Donelly village

Gravel roads need to be graded fully, minimum twice a year and problem areas addressed. The town needs a bypass road either west or east of Hampton St. (preferably west).



Greater attention to local, rural roads. No feedback on important road issues (incompetant)

Have a specific road maintenance and improvement strategy. [gravel roads upgrade].

I understand that in a rural community that there are many smaller roads but lors of these are in a poor condition.

If there was a bad fire in the region the fire units wouldn't be able to access because the roads sides are fire hazards. Ratepayers must do firebreaks.

Improve gravel roads and repair Winnejup Road. Provide safe additional parking for main street.

Improve local roads gravel

Improved focus on maintenance of unsealed roads

Improved maitenance of local reads, water management of drains, corrugations and pot holes.

Instead of keeping on grading unsealed roads which costs money, bitumin would be better for example the area outside the Cemetary.

Local raods - most gravel roads are in poor condition at least 60% of the year

Local reads that are gravel, need to be bitumised such as Eedle Terrace.

Local roads - outer area of shires don't have much service as improvement of roads. Roadside clean up - not enough weed control eg balckberries, trimming of trees and general maintenance of outer roads and road verges in outlying area. Pay a lot in rates for not much return.

Local roads - seal local road that are relatively central. Gravel sheeting is not acceptable (e.g. West Blackwood Terrace) so close to town and along our major natural asset which is the river.

Local roads especially gravel. They are full of potholes. Never graded.

Local roads including gravel roads need to be maintained better especially in winter and grading timed suitably to avoid further damage.

More work on verges in outlying roads

Roads like Campells Rd and Elwins Rd should not still be gravel in this day and age. Council allowed the development of sub-divisions in KangaroonGully including Bridgetown Gardens etc and funnelled all traffic along Turner rd (Steere St etc), which also puts pressure on the junction of Steere and Hampton Rd. Upgrading Campbell's would allow people to go to the tip more readily (no rubbish collection) and get in/out when heading north bypassing town. Most people avoid gravel roads if possible.

Some Shire roads are down to 10 km/h at some time of the year, and even at 10 still a rough ride.

Some shire roads, particularly out of town are poorly maintained.

Sunridge drive in turning into a speedway. Put signs up and reduce speed on Whittells Rd and Sunridge drive to 50 klm.

Surface all gravel roads in the town area as ratepayers pay the same rates as others who have street lights and bitumen roads.

#### **Building and maintaining local roads**

Take better care of present roads. Allow residents to maintain road verges.

Take the trucks off the main road and make that precinct llivable

That all need fixing, hopefully then the school bus won't crash

The local roads around town are very dangerous. Pot holes everywhere and hard to get off the side.

The maintaining of inter town roads ie Bridgetown to Nannup , Bridgetown to Boyup Brook, not necessarily the roads but road shoulders

The roads are in a bad way in town and in rural areas. Repair the local rural roads, many have pot holes and sides of roads slide away when raining.

The school bus had an accident in Lefroy Road. Walter Road continually has pot holes, large at times, at the beginning of the gravel section. Bitumenising would fix these problem areas.

The Shire has good road maintenance equipment but it's not being utilized to its full capacity.

The unsealed roads around the shire need to be maintained regularly over the year.

There are lots of local roads that are gravel with high amounts of traffic using them. Most of them are dangerous and mostly always in poor condition. Connell Rd in Hester for example is always in terrible condition, dangerous to drive on. Most people have to drive on the wrong side of the road to avoid ending up in a culvert.

Think seriously about the trucks through town. A bypass?? Think about the trucks everywhere else more passing lanes.

To allow the main strip to grow and thrive BYPSS IT! Unable to enjoy the area due to car's - trucks etc. 40km doesn't remove the hazard. Don't wait for a tragedy to make changes.

To make our roads & foot paths safe.

Too many roads are still not sealed and the ones that are, don't have lines on curbs or centre. Lack of pathways, street lighting. Good bus shelters for kids catching the school bus. Over hanging huge trees over bus stops and roads, need clearing. Fire hazards too.

Traffic main street needing bypass. Trucks and heavy traffic.

Trees too close to road verge in some areas. Especially Winnejup Road. Mockerdillip, Brockman Hwy, Hester and Tweed Road to name a few.

Try to get extra funding to upgrade our roads.

Upgrading roads that have been patched and patched and are like driving on a gravel road with pot holes and corrugation but are actually bitumen

We have too many gardeners and not enough outside staff. Not enough maintenance done on roads ouside of township.

Widening roads, poor edges, better footpaths to Highlands Estate.



(Footpaths, Trails & Cycleways) Increase the number of these to key areas eg. From the town to the recreation area (football ground) and expand cycle paths/trails in that area to create an exercise area/tourist attraction for cyclists.

5-10 km bitumised cycle / walk path for excercising.

A footpath from the big estates, highlands, Bridgetown Gardens and four seasons into town.

A footpath/cycle path along Brockman Hwy and the river path so that kids can safely ride their bike to and from town and school

Actually build footpaths trails and cycleways for a start. Work with local cycle and walking clubs to figure out what the community wants in regard to this matter instead of stonewalling every idea presented.

Bridgetown is a beautiful and natural environment but does virtually nothing to build or promote it trails and paths. Other than horse trails but I'm not going to say anything on that.

If you are walking to the Library or the Rec Centre from town you are unable to walk on the path on the side that they are located on.

I cannot believe the shire is missing out on the cycling boom that is happening in all the shires that surround us! Nannup, Balingup, Pemberton and Collie have all clicked onto the economic benefits of cyclists. The race in Nannup this weekend has 750 competitors in it, how much money is that flowing into town? The Tour of Margaret River only just makes it to our shire through Greenbushes, obviously the organisers did not get the welcome to Bridgetown they may have liked. We have ideal terrain to connect into this bike craze. It seems if you want a horse trail, funding, anything, there are grants galore and anything is possible. But the minute you mention bikes, it gets shut down. Cyclists are known for sitting in town drinking coffee etc, how good would that be having more people on the street, makes a town look vibrant. Not sure what the grant writer does but there only seems to be a limited amount of grants come into the town, mainly horse orientated, as she is a horse rider and a few others in the shire. We don't even connect to the Munda Biddi, the number of people that ride that, even from oversea, and it appears our shire has made no effort to be involved in it some how. I think missing the whole cycling community is a travesty for our shire as it is growing and will continue to as people are becoming more aware of well being.

I have submitted a request to council for pathways to be constructed from Highlands to the central area of Bridgetown but no action has been taken as yet

I recently assisted an elderly woman who tripped on the path near IGA, this path is very uneven and with a large elderly population, poses an ongoing hazard and potential compensation claims against the shire. Mountain biking options would also be great, with greater development, and public awareness of them. More promotion of activities for younger groups in general would be great.

I would like to see a cycle/walk path from highlands down to a highway over pass bridge and then divide north and maybe running next to the rail reserves the over pass would be great for the safety of children crossing the highway
