What are your biggest goals, hopes and aspirations for the local area?

A recognised tourist destination with lots of activities and things to see. Some sought of recognisable icon, theme or structure that people identify with the town. World class internet. A council that works with and supports business, arts and entrepreneurial endeavour rather than stifling or ignoring as is the current state. Absolutely no-one anything like [private information removed] allowed anywhere near a position of power in the town.

"Be full of strangers", no locals.

..be a united community with a creative vision and a clear plan and means to implement them. The Shire officers will be a cohesive and dynamic forward thinking group. The communities within the shire will be diverse and sustainable in every way and there will be lots of cycle paths for the growing number of people who cycle in the area.

..have to change their attitude towards the people who live and play in the Shire. For some time there has been a 'them and us' attitude. My hope is that the Shire will aspire to develop a closer relationship and friendship with the people from all walks of life within the Shire, not just the 'Who's who' of the art orientated community. A walk down the main street by the Shire representatives and communicating on a regular basis with all the business owners is a sure way of staying in touch and building trust with the community.

- 3. Development of a climate Change policy to support sustainability
- 4. Development of waste strategies that avoid the use of land fill
- 5. Continued improvements in the state of public and private buildings
- 6. Finding efficiencies to reduce the operational costs of the Shire
- 1. Loss of upper teenage/young adults from the community due to a lack of Senior High School facility makes maintenance of the social fabric difficult.
- 2. Development of a more entrenched environmental tourism fabric built in anticipation for either/both of the end of mine life at Greenbushes or simply a commodity price downturn. i.e. How do we not squander the tremendous injection of wealth currently coming into the community.
- 1. Make the swimming pool an indoor one. This is BRIDGETOWN for God's sake! How many days or even hours a year is it open now?
- 2. Get the trucks off the main road. That wouldn't effect businesses or tourism and would make it a superb place to live. It is a disaster at present.



What are your biggest goals, hopes and aspirations for the local area?

5 - 10 km bitumised Cycling / Walk path e.g. similar to what Manjimup has, e.g. through the town and extending out along the flatter road to Manjimup. Would encourage people to get out and get fit, promoting a healthier lifestyle.

Be more for the ratepayers than themselves. Building and planning more efficient.

Be more interested in providing facilities for residents and stop trying to attract tourists so that a select few can profit.

Be more proactive with funding and grants to get the mountain bike trails happening and advertise it.

Be more user friendly place to live for seniors. There will be no spraying of roundup in the Shire. Footpaths will be prioritised and maintained. Local wildlife will be protected and pests like rabbits and fixes removed.

Be not changed to be like a Margaret River like town. Bridgetown Greenbushes has its own uniqueness.

Be proactive! And not awaiting complaints from the community before taking action on issues needing fixing.

Be responsive to community concerns about the impact of invading species for example blackberry infestation, particularly alongside road verges. After asking several times for the Shire to eradicate this vegetation pest the Shire just ignores pleas to spray or destroy, even though the vegetation is accessible.

Have an indoor pool added to the current complex. The skate park will be up there with the best in Regional WA, incorporating outdoor sporting complex, well lit for evening competitions of basketball etc; Substantial, well researched and planned children's playground - security cameras in place and working. The "PC we've ticked the boxes" oversized/underused monstrosities loosely referred to as "gym" equipment will have long gone from this area and Somme Park will be clean with pathways meandering through an interesting parkland incorporating a family friendly picnic area with toilets. The Main Street will rival main streets in Donnybrook and Balingup with its beautiful plantings and evenly paved pavements enhancing and complimenting the lively store fronts. The poorly surfaced main road with its health and safety hazard lumps and bumps will have been replaced by a smooth surface, enabling a safe traverse from one side to the other without tripping up in the middle of a busy road. The piece of wasteland on the left at the southern end of the Main Street will have been purchased by the Shire and developed into a garden area with seating and toilets, enabling strollers to take a breather/eat the ice cream they've just purchased and re-group ready for the next leg of their journey. Both ends of town will be welcoming, neat and tidy with garden beds always in bloom and well cared for, giving people the idea to break their journey here rather than elsewhere. The old Kordics building, the packing sheds and the land in front of and surrounding it that looked so unsightly and uninviting in 2020, will have been removed or tastefully renovated and utilised with parking available thus complimenting the Fats complex and promoting a stop off point for visitors. The tired, uninteresting and boring "play" equipment at the old boat park a little further down the road will have been replaced by a family friendly area with a maze made from a native hedge to encourage families to play together, plenty of garden bench type seating and barbecue area, complete with a modern toilet block incorporating wheelchair facilities accessible from both the park and the street. Large street signs at all entries into Bridgetown giving clear directions to caravan parking area in Steere Street, disabled parking areas, gas refill facility and toilet facilities ensuring that visitors know they can break their stay here and know exactly where is the best spot for their parking needs. Disabled parking will be dotted around town enabling everybody to access our beautiful part of the world.

Have an updated main street and side streets, provide more entertainment for residents, maintain roads better, offer numerous culturally diverse restaurant options, more medical and allied health professional and specialist functions, provide ratepayers with value for money from rates

Have better tourist facilities. Better local roads, more footpaths, stricter laws governing feral animals. Particularly cats. Stricter laws governing cleaning of land particularly roadside verges by farmers (re)building fences. Better fire management eg more firebreaks.

Have cleaned up the road verge areas on the north entrance to the town maybe even planted new vegetation.

Have footpaths to town from local streets so we don't fall over. The bridgetown pool will be heated so we don't have to travel 35kms to Manjimup for a swim and warm water for our aching bones and will then spend money locally rather than another town. The shire will be more transparent and when we fill out these surveys they will be listened to, rather than work with their own agenda.

More facilities activities for children in later primary school and early teens and a Shire who encourage and help people to achieve their dreams rather than finding barriers to stop them. Indoor swimming pool for year round exercise and therapy. Have more recycling.

Have more for visitors to do, families to play, we do the blues and other things but nothing family orientated for family's to stop and play at a nice playground, to eat at local businesses and purchase at local shops.

have more resources and help for the aged and aging population residents.

have more parking

better north entrance area to the town

Have more social activities for people to do. More trails, more shire backing for community groups. Less staff within the office and those there would be more productive. Focus on tourism and development

I would hope that the Shire applies for many grant funding options, which supports a progressive environment for tourist participation eg street scaping, support of art projects or maintaining the building facades.

The current Shire does not work with the community to achieve shared community objectives. The power rests with a few Councillors and key staff and they are a law unto themselves with what happens in this community, with seemingly no accountability. The CEO of the Shire staff is ineffective in managing his staff and is known as a puppet with strings pulled by a few staff. The majority of councilors seem to blindly accept any information staff presented to them in spite of often loud and widespread protest to be otherwise heard by relevant vested community groups. The community groups are mostly backed by highly skilled and appropriately qualified members, experts and opinions. Many Councilors seem to have little or no idea, interest or care in significant matters they vote on. Maybe there is truth in widespread local comment that they are there as Councilors for personal ego or to top up their retirement funds? Until and unless there are dramatic changes in the staffing and organizational modes of operation in this Shire it is futile to think about other changes in this community for they will not come about

What are your biggest goals, hopes and aspirations for the local area?

With 3 primary school age kids, felt the town lacked activities for them.

There are no trails around town other than the river walk and was surprised/disappointed how poorly maintained the path and the surrounds is, The river walk near the caravan park is in a truly lovely location but the path is unsafe to run or ride on. There is great potential along this river walk area for maybe a nature playground or a featured nature walk like at Norhtcliffe.

We actually ended up travelling away from Bridgetown during the days to do activities with the kids-Pemberton for bike and walk trails, Manjimup to timberpark, Boyup Brook to great museum there. We did ask around tourist bureau and in shops but seems there are no real attractions as such to engage this age group.

With consistently cleaner public amenities greater effort to encourage, with appropriate marketing, tourism. This should support economic development and job creation particularly for younger people. Correct marketing will encourage people to visit and stay however it needs a proactive approach and not the negative reactive situation which appears in senior staff.
